How to Spot a Recruitment Scam

Suspicious communication

Be cautious of unsolicited messages from unfamiliar sources, especially if the email domain does not match Wolf & Company's official business. We will **never** contact you from free email services (e.g., Gmail, Yahoo) or unverified platforms. Only emails from **wolfandco.com** should be considered valid.

Requests for sensitive information or payment

Wolf & Company will never request personal data, such as your Social Security number, date of birth, bank account information, or passport details, during the application stage.

Unapproved interview platforms

All interviews are conducted only through our approved systems. Be cautious of invitations to use platforms or links that do not originate from Wolf & Company. Always check sender information and meeting links carefully.
